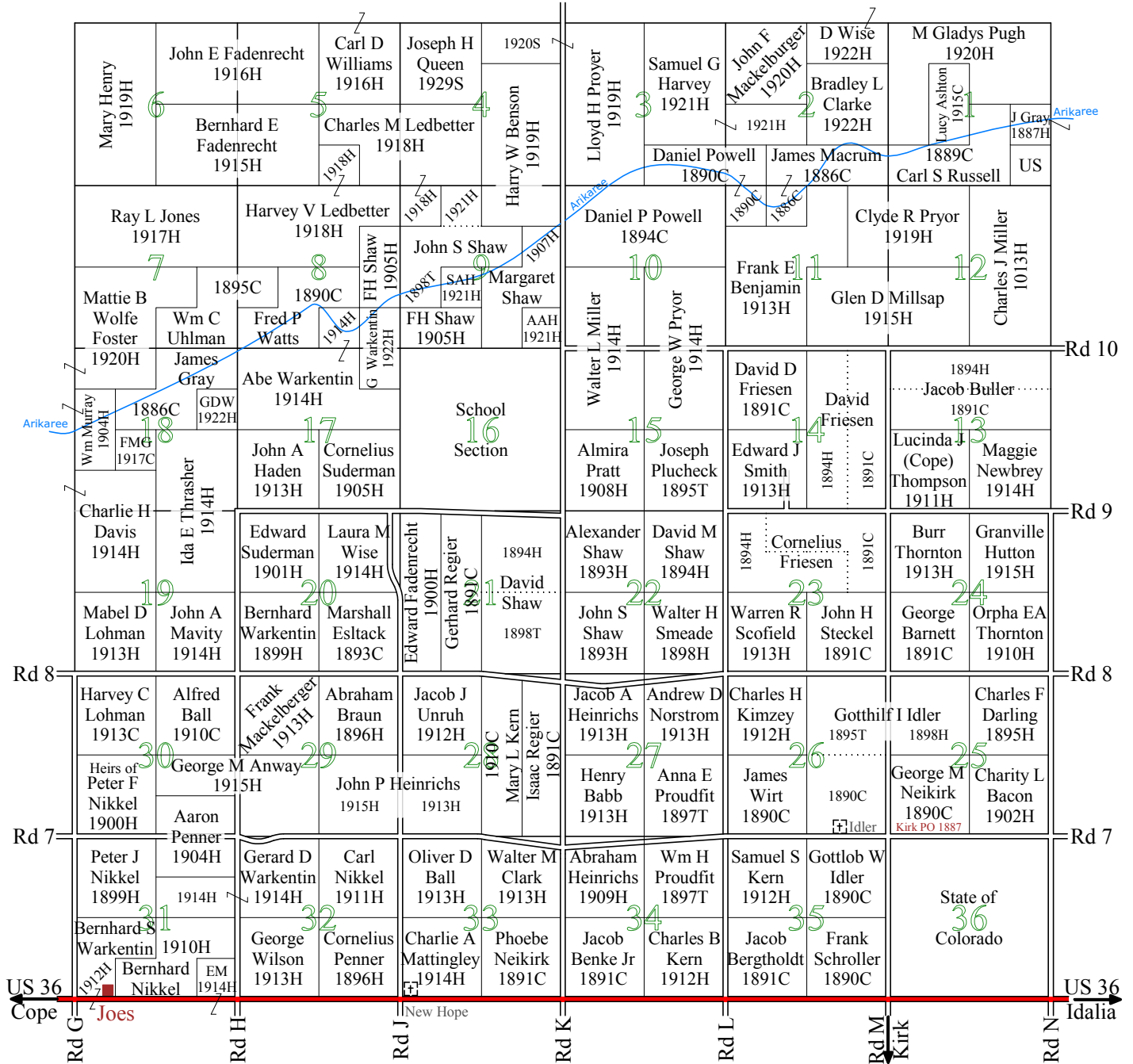

George M Neikirk established the Kirk post office on his farm in 1887. When Rueben Kline took over as postmaster in 1890, it was moved four miles south to its present location.

G. I. Idler's given name has been spelled at least four ways including the "Gotthilf" adopted here which was on two of his three patents in this township and on Tombaugh's translation of his Idler Cemetery marker. It was locally pronounced and spelled in Oestman's book "Gotthilp."
