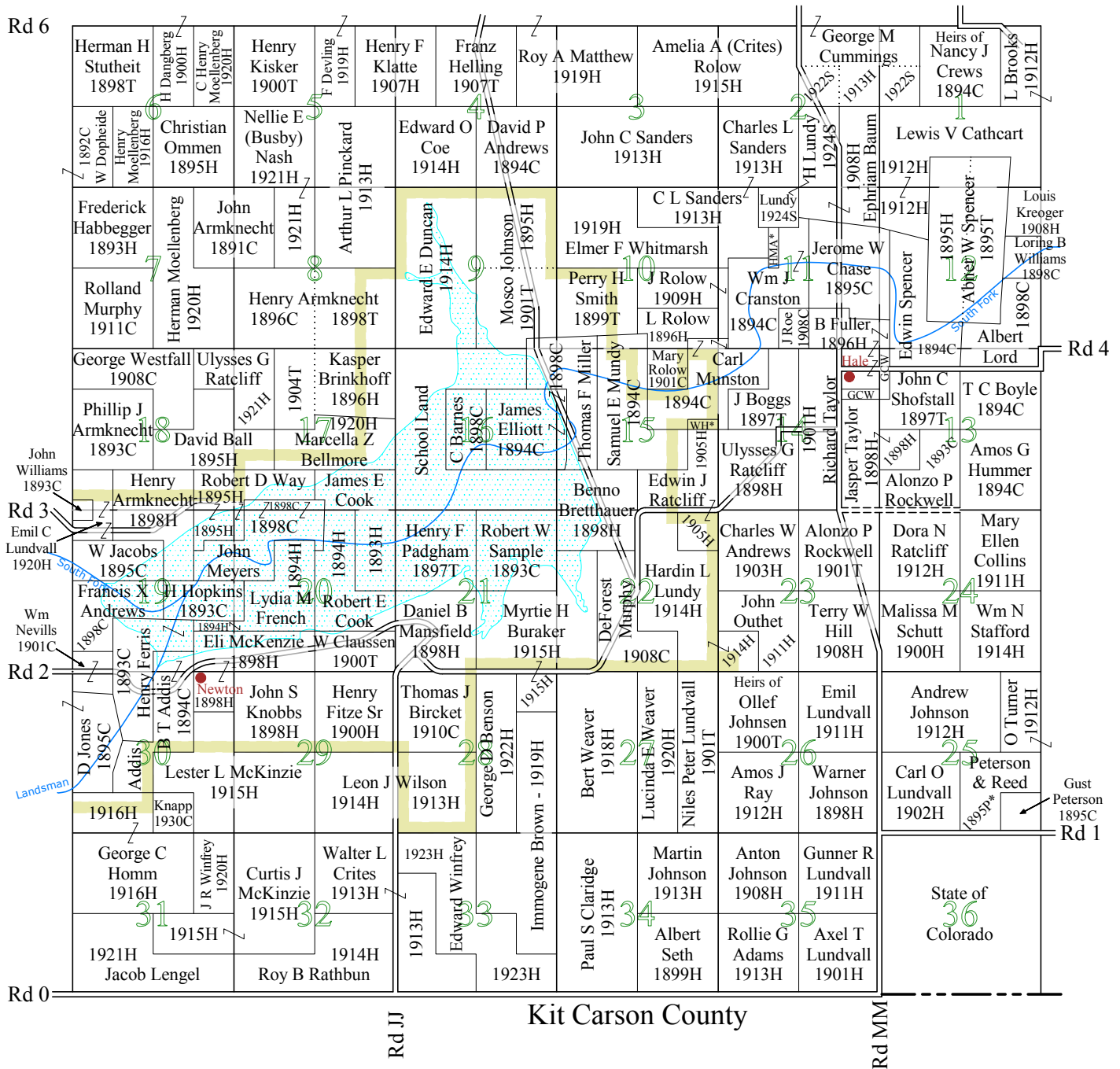


Township 5 South Range 43 West Yuma County, Colorado

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Notes:

The cyan area shows the mean extent of the Bonny Reservoir water surface inside the yellow 'State Park' border.

The Hale post office is shown in its modern location. It first operated from 1890 to 1894 on the Alonzo Rockwell farmstead. Mail service was then provided from Newton until Hale was reopened in 1900 in the Richard Taylor store very near where it is shown on the map. It closed in 1982.

The Newton post office operated from 1889 to 1918 from several homes near where it is shown on the map.

There was apparently a name correction to the 1893 Frederick Habegger/Habbegger patent (S7) but, lacking an image, we couldn't determine which was correct.

William Hollowell's 1920 patent (S15) was for "William M. Hollowell - assignee of George Hill and John B. Hughes."

The Peterson & Reed 1895 patent (S25) was issued to Gust Peterson and George Reed under the Scrip Act the same day Gust received his Cash Sale patent.
